Dear Art Education Major:

This academic map is a term-by-term sample course schedule. The milestones listed below each term are designed to keep you on course to graduate in four years. Sample schedules are provided as general guideline to help you build a full schedule each term. Courses must be selected with your academic advisor to satisfy all core and major curriculum, as well as meeting accreditation standards such as NASAD (National Association of Schools of Art and Design), edTPA (Education Teacher Performance Assessment), CAEP (Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation) and GaPSC (Georgia Professional Standards Commission) requirements. This program is 132/3 hours; a student must average between 16 and 18 hours each semester in order to graduate within a four-year period or take 6 hours over two or three summer school sessions. CORE and Education courses may be taken during the summer, however, ART, ARTH, and ARED courses are typically offered during the academic year only.

Art educators inspire students around the world, playing a vital role in the lives of children and adults who are interested in art. The art education program at Valdosta State University equips students with the knowledge, skills and experience to become professional art educators or to enter a variety of other professions. Students majoring in art education at Valdosta State take many of the same core classes as students in the general art program but have additional opportunities to gain invaluable teaching experience that will shape their future careers.

Students who complete the major in Art Education will graduate with a Bachelor of Fine Arts - Art Education degree. The National Art Education Association (NAEA) and Georgia Professional Standards Commission (GaPSC) provides program standards, curricular guidelines, and assessment tools that help to ensure a quality program in art education. The Art Education program within Valdosta State University is accredited by the National Association of Schools of Art (NASAD). The Bachelor of Fine Arts with a major in art education prepares students for initial art education certification (P-12). The program is designed to prepare professional art educators with the knowledge, skills, and experiences necessary to be successful in an array of potential career choices, from the art studio classroom, to a museum education setting, to graduate school.

Admission to the Teacher Education Program:

Students must be admitted to Teacher Education in order to enroll in professional education course work. The date of admission to Teacher Education is the date the online application is approved.

Students must meet the following requirements to be admitted to Teacher Education:

- 1. Earned at least 45 semester hours
- 2. Declared a major in the field (Art Education) in which you are applying, leading to teacher certification.
- 3. Maintained at least an overall 2.75 GPA.
 - Passed or exempted the <u>GACE Program Admission Assessment</u> (Georgia Assessment for the Certification of Educators)
 *GACE PAA Exemption: 1000 SAT, 43 ACT, (Combined score English/Math, sometimes referred to as Verbal/Quantitative);
 - Student may elect to take the ACT Residual Exam, (http://www.act.org/aap/infosys/residual.html), See VSU Office of Testing, http://www.valdosta.edu/academics/services/testing/welcome.php
- 4. Successfully completed the Georgia Professional Standards Commission Educator Ethics-Program Entry Assessment.
- 5. After meeting ALL of the ABOVE; complete the Admission to Teacher Education Application Form.

❖ ARED 2999:

Each teacher education program has a "2999" course, titled "Entry to the Education Profession." The "ARED 2999" course is required of all teacher education majors as well as certification students; the course is a prerequisite to the professional education course work in all teacher education programs. Students should enroll in "ARED 2999" course the semester following the successful completion of 45 hours. Students should continue to enroll in the appropriate "2999" course each semester until an "S" grade is achieved.

- The following requirements must be met for students to earn a grade of "S" in "ARED 2999":
 - 1. Be admitted to Teacher Education in the current major.
 - 2. Hold a valid GaPSC Pre-service Certificate.
 - 3. Earned a grade of "C" or higher in ENGL 1101 and 1102; credit by exam assumes a grade of "C" or higher.
 - 4. Maintained at least an overall 2.75 GPA.
 - 5. Maintained professional liability insurance.
 - 6. Meet all LiveText requirements.

Admission to Teacher Education and satisfactory completion of the appropriate "2999" course for the major are required to enroll in professional education courses. Transfer students who have been admitted to Teacher Education and hold a valid GaPSC Pre-service Certificate will be granted a one-semester waiver to take "2999" concurrently with professional education courses. The Georgia Professional Standards Commission (GaPSC) requires that all teacher candidates hold a valid Pre-Service Certificate in the field in which the candidate is being prepared in order to complete field experiences and clinical practice in P-12 schools.

Students are required to maintain an overall <u>2.75 GPA</u> in order to initially enroll in professional education courses and continue to progress through the professional program. A grade of "C" or better must be earned in the required English courses and in all ART, ARED and EDUC courses in the professional sequence.

Note: The BFA Art Education program is 132/3 hours; A student must average between 16 and 18 hours each semester in order to graduate within a four-year period or take 6 hours over two or three summer school sessions. CORE and Education courses can be taken during the summer sessions, however, ART, ARTH, and ARED courses are typically offered during the academic year only.

Students who are required to take the GACE (Georgia Assessment for the Certification of Educators) GACE Program Admissions Assessment should take it prior to, or during ARED 2999. GACE Program Admissions Assessment must be passed to enter the Senior Curriculum sequence. Students are required to take the GACE Content Assessment prior to the Student Teaching semester. Certification depends on passing the GACE Content Assessment.
